On Saturday, March 23 at 7:00 PM, there is only ONE place to be: CBJ!!

What to Bring:

1. Ears

(to hear the Megillah read by our erstwhile chanters and readers)

2. Masks and Costumes Required!!

(for all ages, come as you're not - or as you really are!)

3. Favorite noisemakers

(feel free to get creative)

4. Gifts of Food for Friends

(at least 2 different kinds of food - cookies, candy, hamantaschen, fruit - to be delivered at your leisure in the evening or the next day)

5. Tzedakah

(collection will be taken during the service)

And then all you need to do is add "feasting" that night or during the following day before sunset, and along with 1. Hearing the Scroll of Esther/Megillat Esther read out loud, 2. Giving gifts of at least 2 different kinds of foods to friends (Mishloach Manot), and 3. Giving Tzedakah (Matanot L'Elyonim), you'll have fulfilled all the traditional mitzvot/commandments/requirements for fully observing Purim.

IN OUR COMMUNITY

Pesach 2024/5784 Sale of Chametz

It's traditional to remove all *chametz* from our houses for the full duration of *Pesach*. In recognition that it's not always practical for people to get rid of so much stuff, it's permissible to seal off access to all chametz until *Pesach* is over, and then to transfer the ownership of all non-*Pesach* food and utensils (*chametz*) that remain on our premises during the eight days of the festival.

The Rabbi will be happy to act as the Legal Agent in transferring the ownership of your *chametz* to a non-Jew during this period. I would like to emphasize the double importance of this *mitzvah*. First, by doing so you will be removing all *chametz* from your home during *Pesach*, and second, any funds raised as a result of this *mitzvah* will be applied to a special fund to help needy Jews during the holiday and the rest of the year.

Please clip the form below. Fill out the form authorizing the Rabbi to sell your *chametz* in keeping with Jewish tradition, and then mail or email to the Congregation office.

In performing this *mitzvah*, it is customary to make a donation, which will be used for worthy purposes at *Pesach* time and throughout the year. Please make checks out to the **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund**.
