

Jewish Songwriters Give Universal Voice To The American Dream



Pianist/Singer/Lecturer Fred Miller has created more than 70 highly entertaining and informative lectures-in-song on the "golden age of American popular music." This one highlights the work of Jewish composers from that era, including Rodgers and Hammerstein, George and Ira Gershwin, Jerome Kern, Harold Arlen, and Irving Berlin.

Between 1880-1920, Jews arrived by the millions in America from Eastern Europe & Russia. They found a chance for life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness that had before only existed in their most fevered imaginations. Nowhere were the Jews in America more successful than in their songwriting for Tin Pan Alley, Vaudeville, Broadway, and Hollywood. These sons of immigrants infused their songs with the hopes and dreams of their ancestors, and in doing so created such enduring classics as <u>Brother, Can You Spare a Dime?</u>, Oh, What a Beautiful Mornin', I Got Rhythm, Summertime, Someone to Watch Over Me, Ol' Man River, It's Only a Paper Moon, Some Enchanted Evening, You'll Never Walk Alone, Blue Skies, What'll I Do?, Cheek to Cheek, Puttin' On the Ritz, There's No Business Like Show Business, God Bless America, and Over the Rainbow.

Fred Miller will combine his voice, keyboard skills, and encyclopedic musical knowledge to present a fascinating look at the Jewish immigrant experience and the timeless music it produced.


